Also then use the same to plant churches where they are not. 

A NEW CHURCH STARTED IN NYAKANDA REFUGEE CAMP

Through the efforts of Brother Guy Nkurikiye and Evangelist Ahadi Mathieu, a church by the name Mount Zion Christian Church, was started on 1st December 2019 in Nyakanda Refugee Camp, Burundi, as a member of CRC. Prior to its official opening function, the church held with a big concert on 29th November 2019 with a theme: PEACE, UNION and SOCIAL COHESION. During which occasion, 27 people accepted Jesus as their personal Saviour.

According to Evangelist Ahadi Mathieu, we thank God very much that since its official opening to date, the number of church members has been increasing. So far, it has 217 church members comprising 25 men, 73 women, 33 boys, 47 girls and 39 children. Among women members, 31 are widows them.


The church is served by 5 Pastors, 2 Evangelists and 8 Deacons. When the church succeeds obtaining means of transport it envisages opening its branches in other provinces of the country so that they also become members of CRC.

EXPECTED VISITING MISSIONARIES AND FUTURE PLANS

Ps Phil Cayzer and Ps John Zembwe have plans of facilitating CRC missionaries to visit Africa in 2020 and their itinerary will be rolled out for information, well in time.

Ps Mike Cronin (National Australian CRC Missions Director) and his wife Ps Lois Cronin just confirmed they will be traveling to Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi and Kenya for 3 weeks in March 2020. Please be praying for their short visit that God will protect them on the way and use them in the best way possible for His glory and that they will be effective in seeing the ministry of God's Grace being inspired and released in the churches and Bible schools they will be able to visit.

Ps John Zembwe has just confirmed that soon he will be able to return to visit much of the CRC work in Africa. He intends



spending up to two months in *different nations encouraging and teaching* in churches and CRC Bible colleges. Also he will be preparing the ground for the CRC "Missions Mobilization" that will happen in August 2020.

Missions Mobilization – in August 2020 CRC intends inviting key leaders from all African countries it has so far made its footprint, who believed God for their own funding to be rally together in Njoro, Kenya to be part of its inaugural African Great Lakes' CRC Pastors and Leaders' Conference. At this time Ps Phil is believing that we will have over 20 CRC Pastors from Australia coming to attend the conference. It will be a time for linking CRC Leaders together and to meet with many Australian CRC Pastors. The gathering will then be part of a number of graduations of Certificate and Diploma graduates receiving their awards in Kenya.

CRC will then ask the Australian CRC Missionaries to accompany the assembled African Pastors and Leaders at Njoro back to their respective nation's and ministries' working areas/stations. Also at that time, Ps Phil Cayzer and Ps John Zembwe will be
